Greens Renovation

What

 Scarify, hollow tine, backfill with top dressing, over seed and fertilise

Why

- Removes thatch encourages firmer greens in winter
- Relieves compaction & helps drainage
- Aerates the turf & roots
- Encourages deeper stronger roots
- Encourages healthy disease free grass
- Leads to good putting surfaces through the year

Greens Enhancement

Objective

 To increase the proportion of good quality grass in the greens – bentgrass (agrostis tenuis)

Why

- More resistant to disease
- Grows at lower temperatures, so earlier in the year
- Faster speed for any given cut hight

How

- Frequent over seeding
- Not cutting every day
- Managing the amount of water applied

Why we Aerate the Greens

- Prevent disease
- Improve drainage, moisture penetration and alleviates dry patches
- Removes thatch & breaks down organic matter
- Aerates the soil & encourages deeper root growth

To give us good true firm putting surfaces through the year.

A Typical Day / Week for a Green Keeper

- Arrive at 6:15am
- Assess what the Greens need
 - Cut (hand or triplex), roll and/or iron
 - Change hole positions
 - Check for disease & any treatments needed
 - -All weather dependant
- Daily rake bunkers, move tee markers
- Cut twice a week tees, fairways, aprons & surrounds
- Cut once a week rough & semi
- Divot short holes once a week

Projects For This Winter

Focus on repairing the areas that wear out due to heavy use and poor ground conditions

- 1st behind and to the right of the green
- 2nd between green and 3rd tee
- 6th in front of the bunker on the left
- 8th in front of the green
- 17th between green and 11th tee
- Various small bare areas on fairways

Future Projects

2016/7 -

- 5th left of the green
- 18th left of the green
- Pond between the 8th and 11th finish off
- Pond on the 10th open it up, improve appearance
 Future -
 - Path to 13th back tee starting by bunker on 12th
 - Drain 7th fairway
 - Drain 9th fairway
 - Rebuild 18th tee
 - Rebuild 1st winter tee
 - Enlarge 7th yellow & white tee

Winter Play

Recognising the amount of heavy wear and damage we get the intention this winter is to -

- Use mats on fairways
- Rope off areas prone to wear to keep players and trolleys away
- Encourage members to carry if possible
- Encourage members to fit winter wheels to electric trolleys
